Now in its second year, this symposium will explore the need for ethical and responsible AI and the importance of humanising machine intelligence.

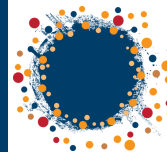
Participants will:

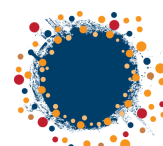

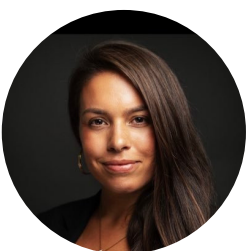

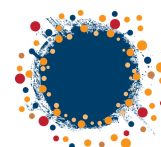

Applying AI in a responsible manner and strategies to mitigate risk

QUT is Australia's first university to use Pepper specifically for a social robotics research platform, trialling Pepper at Townsville Hospital.

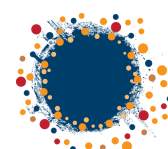


PROFESSOR BELA STANTIC

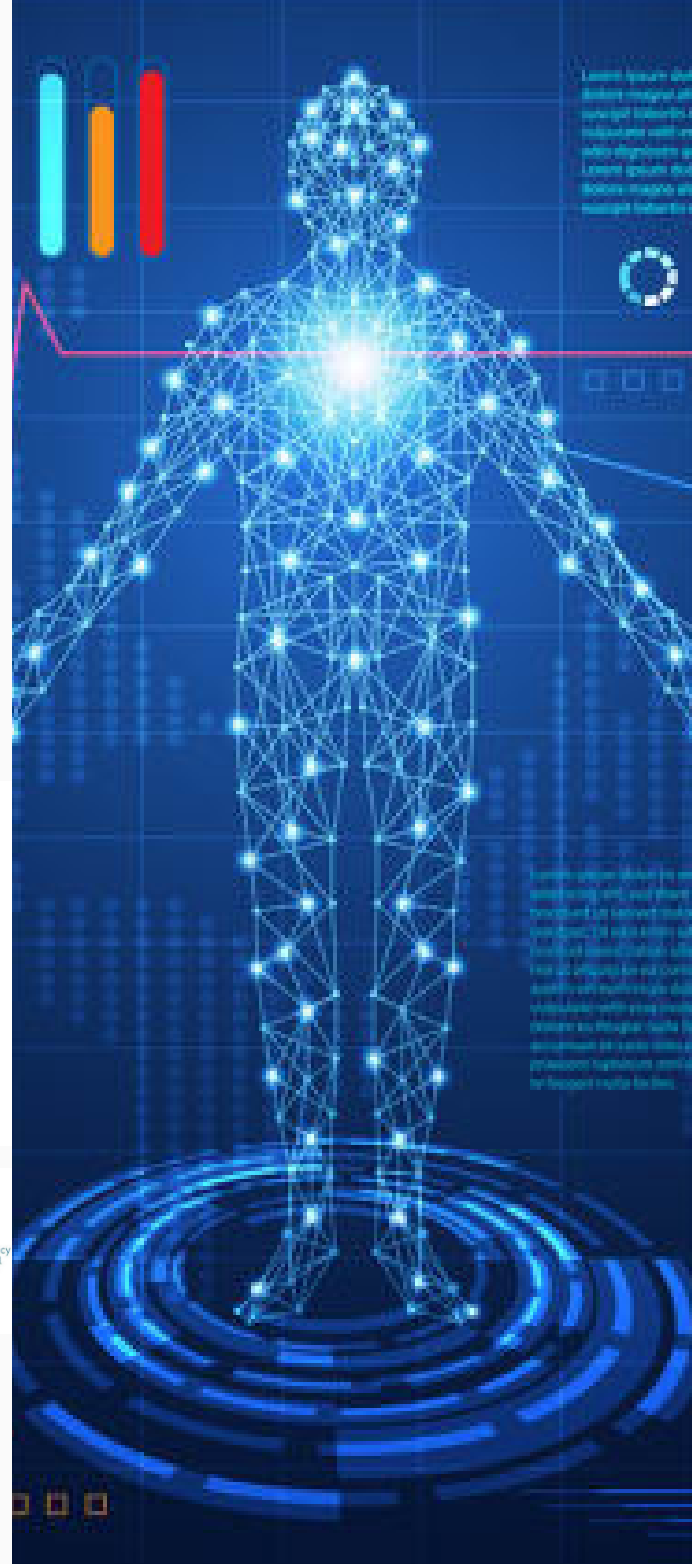
